# KENYON JUNCTION

This is a proposed Railway Station to be resurrected at Kenyon Junction, which was originally opened in 1831 and served the whole community until 1st August 1963. The re-opening would serve all the people of Leigh, Pennington, Lowton, Lane Head, Golborne, Croft, Culcheth, Risley and Glazebury - a vast amount of commuters (it is 10 acres in size).

The reason for suggesting this route is because it would be a direct extension of **Atherleigh Way** which brings people from the heart of Leigh at Twist Lane and Leigh Sports Village, where 'Park and Ride' could be accommodated, as well as existing parking at Kenyon Junction.


As well as Leigh Guided Bus Way going to Manchester, this existing railway line would give every person in the community a good choice of travel from their nearest access.

Because most of the infrastructure is already in place, e.g. site, good access, recently completed new surface water drainage, Pallestrade fencing and most importantly, Network Rail Infrastructure have started their 'Electrification' of this existing Liverpool to Manchester Line from this site. These are already costed in, and need not be priced in again. All civils and excavation can be accommodated on site and landscaped, saving extensive tipping and removal costs.

This project should be completed for less than 25% of the Stobart costs, which makes the Guided Bus Way and Kenyon Junction cost effective.

#### TRANSPORT FOR ALL

- a) we need Wigan to consider the proposal along with Warrington, as this site was originally in Wigan but changed boundaries.
- b) and most importantly, we need Network Rail to consider stopping the train at Kenyon, where there are 3 trains per hour in each direction perhaps we could begin with stopping the train every hour until we judge demand.


The size of the site showing old lines and extent of Railway.





Proposed railway station with associated infrastructure, Kenyon Railway Station, off Wilton Lane, Cuicheth
